While I was at Gethsemani Abbey in Kentucky, I had the opportunity to read, pray and hike the rolling hills of the countryside (some of which were decidedly steeper than my experience of hills!). Being surrounded by simplicity and nature helped me to meditate on the love of Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit within our congregation. I spent time in prayer for the congregation and its people as well as for our community partners and, most importantly, for our future.

These are two pictures I took just before I left:





The first picture is of a peach tree stump in our side yard. The branches coming from the root of the stump are also peaches. The second picture shows that those new branches are already producing fruit!

Those new branches could not have grown if not for the old stump. The old stump needs the new branches to produce fruit.

And so I'm pondering and praying for what God is doing new among us...and if we will let God do that. What fruit is being produced? Is it the fruit of the Spirit? Is God creating love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control among us? Is God creating those things in our neighborhood through us?

I hope you'll join with me in pondering how God is still writing Easter hope for us in this world. I hope you'll join with me in pondering how we are still producing fruit—by being the stump that undergirds the new growth…or by doing something new ourselves!
