

Redemptive Work offers coaching and connects people who have barriers to employment with services which can help them get on their feet. Redemptive Work is paid by the pound for the shoes they collect from all over the city.

In addition to the good that you can do through Redemptive Work, which is a ministry of Parker Lane UMC, another congregation here in Austin, you can keep lots of shoes out of the landfill! Over 600 million shoes from the US alone wind up in landfills every year. Instead, these shoes will be taken and used to provide jobs, either by repairing them or by using them as raw materials for economic opportunity in developing countries—helping to lift people out of poverty both here in Austin and overseas!

Pastor's Corner

"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." Isaiah 43:19

At our Church Conference a couple of weeks ago, I showed a Pixar "short"—one of the short cartoons that Pixar shows before its feature-length movies. It's called "Lifted", and it depicts what amounts to an alien "driving test" in which a young alien is attempting to abduct a sleeping person from their bed. He presses wrong buttons from amongst the thousands in front of him, and the man (still sleeping!) is shown bouncing all around his bedroom. Even when it looks like he has gotten it right, he presses a button too soon and the man plummets to the ground, only to be saved by the instructor, who quickly rights everything. The instructor, who takes the wheel of the spaceship from the trainee, watches as the trainee dissolves into a puddle of tears. Finally, the instructor relents and allows the trainee to fly off, but not before the trainee drives the spaceship into the ground and ends up hauling a lot of the dirt off with him. It's a funny coming-of-age story.

I talked about how Memorial seems to be in a time of transition—which is essentially what "coming of age" is. Our financial situation has had a huge turn this year. For the last two years, we were able to fund all of our ministries and the building and staff and even consider major repairs and expansion. This year, we are facing a \$35-\$40,000 deficit. Instead of panicking, I suggested that this may be God's way of saying that it is time to completely rethink how we go about ministry.

In "Lifted", the young alien is faced with a dizzying array of possibilities. While the situation may seem silly to illuminate the state of our congregation, we are faced with a similarly dizzying array of possibilities. We push one button or invite one person, and things seem to go in the right direction. But then we push another button and all of a sudden, we have dropped an average of 10 in worship. Or we think we're on the cusp of something amazing and then at the last minute, we move sideways into unfamiliar territory. It's difficult to know what to do, and we'd like to impress our Teacher—we'd like to drive our own ship.

Here's the thing. The Teacher in the seat next to us is trustworthy. Jesus doesn't so much want to be impressed by us as to see us doing what we're called to do—and to remember that this is God's kingdom, not our own. Our task is faithfulness to the primary mission—the making of disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. We have to depend on God to make a river in the desert…a new way where there seems like no way. BUT—we have to be willing to follow in that Way.

So what we are called to do in the moment is to take the time to pray and discern—we are asked to perceive what it is that God is doing. What if we have all that we need to do what God is calling us to do, even if that looks different from what we've always done? Perhaps it is time not to look to impress God or ourselves or our neighbors, but to simply ask "what's next?". And then to ask "how might we most faithfully get to the place God wants us to be?". And then, no matter what those changes might look like, no matter where it takes us, do what God is asking us to do.

Maybe then our neighborhood—and us!—together might be "lifted" up for the sake of witnessing to God's movement in our midst. My prayer is that you will pray along with the leadership of the church—for faithfulness in all things: in our giving and in the way we do ministry.
