"Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way." (Matthew 1:18a)

I have a few books that I love to keep around at Christmas and read through again. Two of my favorites are WH Auden's *For the Time Being*, which is really a long-form poem, and Walt Wangerin's *The Manger Is Empty*. I love



Wangerin's especially right now for this passage:

"Parents, if you haven't already told your children the story, who has? What sort of Gabriel brought it to them? Don't you know that the teller shapes the tale?

Grandparents, are you satisfied to let mumbling Rumor garble this marvelous story for your grandchildren? Should they piece it together themselves, from Christmas carols and that dead set, that mercenary invasion, that box of empty sentiment and silliness, the television? 'The true meaning of Christmas'—indeed!

No, but faith should tell the tale. And love should serve it to the children lovingly. For it recounts no less than the beginning of the child's salvation.

Then you should tell it to the little ones whom you love, whose spirits you are responsible for. You tell it. You.

Fathers, make a holy time in which nothing distracts you and nothing delights your children except this story. Mothers, prepare a holy space in a corner of your home. Time and space will prove the story important. Grandma, Grandpa, present a holy attitude. You reach to an ancient bedrock for this story. Both the age in your face and the love in your eye will convince the child of that, and of its truth.

Then tell the story whole, beginning to end, all of a piece, and seamless.

Say, 'Child I want to tell you a story beautiful and true. I actually happened; it happened for you."'

I love this passage because I believe it's not just for parents and grandparents but all people who find those who don't know the Story or who only know it from the perspective of mass media. Can you tell this story? Can you tell it, not just laying the pieces from end to end, but with wonder and power and awe and love in your voice?

In this season, ponder how you first heard the

Christmas story—the story from the Bible, not just the stories of Frosty and Santa and their kin. What about this story captivated you? From whom did you hear it?

Practice this story. While waiting in line, think through the different pieces of it: Gabriel coming to Mary, Elizabeth celebrating with

Mary, Joseph finding out but refusing to divorce Mary, the call for the census, Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem, trying to find a room but only finding the stable, the birth, the announcement of the angels to the shepherds and their visit to the manger. And of course, the way that a jealous Herod caused Joseph and Mary to flee as refugees to Egypt until it was safe to come home.

This story is the one in which God chooses to become one of us. It shows that God was willing to become vulnerable on behalf of us. The story itself will teach you how wondrous it is when we contemplate how to live in the current day and age, 2000+ years later.

It teaches us how to welcome, how to trust, how to celebrate, how God speaks. If you practice it, telling it at all different moments of the day, you might find yourself living in a different way (for we are all in need of repentance). And that will be Good News of glad tidings all over again.
