

Pastor's Corner

"After Jesus was born in Bethlehem village, Judah territory— this was during Herod's kingship—a band of scholars arrived in Jerusalem from the East. They asked around, 'Where can we find and pay homage to the newborn King of the Jews? We observed a star in the eastern sky that signaled his birth. We're on pilgrimage to worship him.'" Matthew 2:1-2 (The Message translation)

A few years ago, I heard a haunting song originally written by a group called The Roches. Though the story we receive from the Bible has the scholars/Wise Men/Magi following the star to greet the new king, this song ponders whether or not a shepherd could have seen it also and wondered whether or not to follow. *Star of wonder in the Heavens
Wonder what you want of me
Should I follow you tonight
Star of wonder?*

*I am just a lonely Shepherd
Watching from a distant hill
Why do you appear to me
Star of wonder?*

*If you will
In the morning they'll come looking for the
Shepherd on the hill
What would make her leave her flock?
For surely she must love them still.*

*Star of wonder in the heavens
Are you just a shining star
Or should I follow you tonight
Star of wonder?*



Scripture tells us that the shepherds were greeted by an unmistakable heavenly host, and the scholars/wise men/magi were bold enough (or rich enough!) to spend potentially two years on the road searching. But what about those of us who are not visited by unmistakable signs? What about those of us who don't have the leisure or ability to go on what might be a wild good chase for two years?

This song asks questions I find in my real life. The Shepherd wonders what the star wants and why it's appearing to her. She wonders how others will perceive her actions. She wonders if the star is really what she thinks it is. She says she is alone.

As we enter 2019, you may know exactly what everyone wants of you, where you're headed and why and what the implications will be for yourself and everyone around you. But if you're not, I invite you to sit with the Shepherd, to join a Sunday School class or consider a small group Bible study, to join the choir or to be with others who can help you ponder and wonder and see where God is leading you. May our days, as they grow lighter, be full of the knowledge and love of God.

Thank you for blessing Troop 45400 with a warm welcome to your campus in September. We will look forward to meeting members of your congregation and participating in some of your outreach ministries.

Our troop was formed after two of our co-leaders discovered a shortage of (non-school based) Girl Scout Troops in East Austin. Created to serve girls living in Windsor Park, Mueller, University Hills, Cherrywood and the surrounding areas, this is our 3rd year of scouting and we are grateful to have a comfortable meeting location for the 9 Brownie and 2 Junior scouts of our troop. Our troop is a member of the Walnut Creek Service Unit of the Girl Scouts of Central Texas.

Scouting brings together our uniquely diverse group of girls, who otherwise attend many different schools (including Blanton Elementary, Maplewood Elementary, Magnolia Montessori, Acton Academy, Paragon Prep, the Austin International School and home school co-ops). Finding friends within the neighborhood/local area has been a key benefit for our girls.

For the first 2 years of our troop, we met at the home of one of the co-leaders.

The church provides us much needed shelving space for our supplies and a child appropriate classroom space for our quieter activities. We enjoy the use of the gym for our more vigorous activities, such as those related to dancing, crafting, playing games and sports (which relate to badges the girls are working towards).

Our troop recently held our Fall campout at the Emma Long State Park, where scouts worked on requirements toward a BUG badge, the Painting badge, First Aid. They especially enjoyed climbing the large pecan trees and gathering around the evening campfire.

We are now preparing for the start of COOKIE SALES on Jan. 16, 2019. The girls are currently narrowing in on what portion of their cookie sale funds they plan to allocate for fun, charitable donations and planning future scouting activities. 
