

Two Too Many" A Picture Give Away

The Pastor's Corner

Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. ⁶ Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:5-7

One of my favorite Christmas gifts when I was a kid was a game called "Perfection".

Now, there is probably a whole sermon to be preached or at least a psychological analysis that could be done on me, even if all you knew about the game was its title! But for further context, the game consisted of a board with differently shaped holes in it and individual pieces which could fit into each of the holes. To play, you would mix up the pieces next to the case that the board sat in, then push down the board, which was held in place by a lever. The timer would start and you had 60 seconds to get all 25 of the pieces put in place and hit the stop button before the lever was tripped and the board "popped" up, scattering even the pieces that had been correctly placed.

I was good at it. I liked the task of filling the spaces with their correct piece and doing it in the time allotted. I liked being correct.

I am finding more and more that "correct" answers aren't just sitting around, waiting to be picked up and put into the game boards of Church, Life, Job, School or Family. I am also realizing that wanting to be correct—and to be correct quickly!—was a response to the anxiety created by the timer that was ticking away the seconds, ready to pop up and startle me. (And that's another thing—I *hate* being startled! Why the people on the game box covers always looked overjoyed or amazed when the pieces were popping up was always a mystery to me.)

Over the last month, I've had the opportunity to attend two worship services at Austin Presbyterian Seminary—one led by our former intern, Allison Angell, where she gave her senior sermon, and the other led by Carrie Holly-Hurt, a friend from Windsor Park who is going to seminary to become a Unitarian Universalist pastor. Though each of the services came from a different perspective, I found myself in each of them sitting in the pew having a revelation.

In Allison's service, I found myself held, comforted, beloved—convinced that some of the more difficult circumstances of the Church, Life, Job and Family boxes of my life are not things that are going to keep me from the love of God. In Carrie's service, I marveled at the way I felt the space around me and within me not filled, but created and expanded.

I think, if I—if we!—can remember this move, it can make a difference in how we approach God in our devotional times, our prayer life, our missional outreach, and our worship. We're not just filling the time with readings or prayers or work or praise with "correct" pieces—we are letting the life of God expand in us. When that expansion happens in me, I sense the kind of peace that isn't just still, but alive with hope and promise.

It also means I'm not frantically hunting, trying to find and place those correct pieces against a clock, whether those pieces are the answers to the next steps are for me or for our congregation, for family members, for our neighborhood or for our denomination.

So sit with me. It can be a quiet moment or one that has music or other ambient noise in it. It can be indoors or outdoors. It can be in the dark or in the light. The way I experienced it, I became aware of my own breath, breathing in deeply and intentionally. I let my shoulders drop and did not try to figure out "the answer", but simply pictured and felt God, moving in the space. I knew what I could hold on to in the midst of making decisions, even though the decisions had yet to be made. I knew that I am loved. May it be also so with you.
