**In Memory of
Bill Head Sr.**

William Tremaine Head, Sr. died December 3, 2016. Gazelle Bauer Sump, his beloved friend and companion, had died less than four weeks before. Mr. Head was born January 14, 1918, in Greenville, Texas, to Roy Burke Head and Maude Coffey Head. He grew up in Gainesville, Texas, where he graduated from Gainesville High School in 1936. In 1940, he joined the Army Air Corps. Although Mr. Head spent most of World War II in Texas, in 1945 he was assigned to Iwo Jima where, as part of the 36th Fighter Squadron, he was a P-51 Mustang crew chief. After the war, he was employed with American Airlines for 36 years. He later moved to Austin with his wife, Marie Pace Head, whom he had married in 1942. They were married 55 years until her death in 1997. While in Austin Mr. Head was employed by the Amey Funeral Home, former Land Commissioner Bob Armstrong, and then by the Texas House of Representatives. In 2000, he married Anne Broyles Bridges, who died in 2006. He later moved to Parsons House as an independent living resident. He made many friends and bought a new car when he was 90. It was at Parsons House that he met Gazelle. Ill health forced them to move, at first, to different nursing homes, but they were finally able to reunite and spend the rest of their lives together. Mr. Head will be remembered for his profound sense of fairness, his courtesy, his friendliness, and for his keen sense of humor that was so dry that some people did not get it. Survivors include Mr. Head's son, William Tremaine Head, Jr., and Patricia Winston; his stepson and wife, Drew Bridges and Deborah Bridges, and many nieces, nephews and friends.

After a private family burial, a memorial service was held on Tuesday, December 13, 2016, at 2:00 p.m. at Weed-Corley-Fish Funeral Home, 3125 N. Lamar Blvd.

Finance Update

A called Charge Conference of Memorial UMC met after the December 11th church service, and I am writing to inform you what was decided. The main issue discussed was the budget shortfall Memorial is facing again this year. Our good Lord granted Memorial a number of years of bounty, but 2016 marks our second consecutive year of want.

The Charge Conference voted to meet our current shortfall using an amount up to \$35,00.00 of the funds that were generously donated by past members who have gone on to their heavenly reward. Your Church Council has guarded these funds over the years for just such an eventuality. These funds, however, are not limitless and could be depleted if Memorial must continue to make withdrawals to cover our budget every year. Your Council is aware that members have generously stepped up their giving during the Christmas season in years past, and we hope and pray similar generosity during the 2016 Christmas season will reduce the amount of the anticipated withdrawal.

Memorial is committed to our ongoing community missions and outreach which the church budget helps make possible. We gratefully thank you if you have returned your estimate of giving pledge card, and we ask those who have yet to do so to please send your pledge card to the church office to help your Church Council in their budgetary decisions for 2017. As was mentioned a few Sunday's ago, the Bible urges all members to tithe, but the Lord knows this is not possible for everyone, and we must also remember the saying that the Lord loves a cheerful giver. May we all be cheerful givers in our support of Memorial out of the goodness the Lord has provided each of us.

Hello Dolly "Cake"

- 1 graham cracker crust
- 1 cup chocolate chips
- 1 cup shredded coconut
- 1 cup pecans
- 1 cup eagle brand milk

In the crust, layer the ingredients in same order as above. Bake for about 10 minutes.

Chocolate Pie

- 2 cups milk
- 1 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup flour
- 2 squares chocolate or 1/2 cup cocoa
- 4 eggs separated
- 1 tablespoon vanilla
- 1 tablespoon butter

Combine sugar, salt, flour. Add milk and chocolate. Cook on medium heat until it gets a little thick. Add egg yolks, cook until thick. Add vanilla and butter. Pour into baked pie shell. Top with the beaten egg whites and lightly brown in oven at 325-350 degrees.
