Everyone has a story about their lives. I wish each of you would write yours so we could print it!

It so happens I was asked to write mine and John's— here it goes.

Our story began in 1949. It so happened that both of us were attending Texas Tech University. John came to Seymour, TX working with the Texas Highway Department between semesters. I didn't know it then, but John's older brother Paul was a friend of my dad's and his fishing buddy. I had known him since I was 14 years old. John F. asked me out on a date and I was reluctant at first. Finally we began dating that summer, primarily going to all the rodeo's in the surrounding towns.

When the fall semester began, we both went back to school in our respective dorms, there were no co-ed dorms then. By October we were engaged and planning our wedding for the next June after graduation. In early December my grandfather passed and I left for his funeral. Persistent John called to say repeatedly "let's get married at Christmas!" We did end up getting married over our holiday break on December 28th, 1949.

Next we were back at school, now in the couples dorm which was mostly GI's and we're the youngest of the bunch!

After graduation in May, John began his first full time job in Munday, Texas where we spent the next four years.

In July of 1952 our first daughter was born, Gail Nixon. In July of 53 John got a promotion while still with the highway department and we moved to our first home in Austin on Ridgemont. Memorial was not built yet so we joined Shettles Methodist Church. Two more children and ten years later, Deborah Kay & John Alan Nixon were born and we

joined Memorial United Methodist. This is where we raised our family alongside the Sheltons, Freidrichs, Hausers, Capps, Benninks and so on.... Ahh where has the time gone?

At that point, we had out grown our little home and moved to Windward off Rogge in the country again. Later we moved across town but Memorial is still our home and where our hearts are.

John retired, started his own business, all our children grew up, got married and began their families. Even a fourth generation has begun arriving!

That sums us up. We have been married 70 years this upcoming December 28, 2019.

Our children want to celebrate us at Memorial United Methodist after church service on Sunday Dec. 29, 2019 with a reception in the Parlor.

I do hope you can come and be a part of this happy occasion!





The elders who direct the affairs of the church will be worthy of double honor, especially those whose work is preaching and teaching.
1 Timothy 5:17

“As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. And he said to them, “Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.” Immediately they left their nets and followed him.” (Matthew 4:18-20)

The day Amazon Studios came to film at Memorial was buzzing with equipment all over the building and catering all over the front lawn and people everywhere! This sign was placed outside our choir room to let those folks who had been hired as extras for the day know where they could relax while they were waiting for filming to start.

I got the chance to speak with a couple of the extras as they were standing around the halls. They wanted to know about the church, and one was especially interested in the pipes for the pipe organ (it turned out that he was a former AISD director of fine arts and that he currently attends church with Kent Burrell, the organist who was responsible for getting the pipe façade installed!). There were eight in all—people who had stories of their own and lives of their own and who each had their own excitement about being an extra.

And here’s the thing—not a single one of them had any audible lines on camera, at least that day. They were seen in the background, walking out of our Memorial Room and out the back door. They had been at a sober prayer group meeting according to the script. None of them got to say anything, but their presence implied a whole lot more—their presence was, in fact, crucial to the storyline.

Andrew is one of the disciples that seems like he would be pretty important in the hierarchy—the brother of Peter and one of the first called. Yet there’s only one Gospel (John) where he even gets a speaking line (he introduces the boy with the loaves and fishes to Jesus). Yet his presence and his following Jesus is crucial, not only to his own life story, but also to our understanding that people were willing to follow Jesus in his own day because they believed he had something crucial about life to teach them and they were willing to dedicate their lives pretty completely to him.

You may not feel like you have a significant role in the church or in a life of faith. But your presence—in worship, in discipleship opportunities, in following Jesus intentionally in everyday life—is a crucial part of what God is doing in the world. One would think that God sending the “star”—Jesus!—would be enough. But God so loved the world that he called extras, with stories of their own and a vital role to play in telling the story of Jesus to the world.

Worship Readers Wanted


