With the recent rise in cases and especially in hospitalizations, we are in a holding pattern for worship. Staying with the three



options (online streaming, email and packet mailout) allows us to continue to monitor the trajectory of infections. Once we begin to see a sustained (over two week) fall in the number of hospitalizations, we will begin making plans to return to some form of in-person worship.

IF YOU ARE HAVING PROBLEMS accessing worship online or not getting emails, *please* let us know! We do not intend to leave anyone out of accessing our worship offerings.

BUT—we will be doing some special events in July, including a hymn-sing with hymn stories on July 5 and a communion distribution sometime that month (details are still being worked out).

In addition, we are pleased to announce that because of the electrical storm last October which affected our organ, insurance is helping us get the pipe organ refurbished and transformed. While it will still remain the same pipe organ, some of the safety features will actually allow us to record hymns on it so that we can have the pipe organ played even when no organist is available! The work should be complete somewhere around August/September.

He dearly loved his friends and family and reached out to them constantly. He also lovingly cared for our sweet Mom until her death last September. We will all miss his reminders telling us to check out a beautiful full moon or an incoming storm as well as his nightly calls and texts wishing us goodnight.
