Friedrich, 97, was born
April 30, 1927, to John
Pascal and Clara Cast
Skinner in Buckholts,
TX. She left this life on

Saturday, June 22, 2024, after a long illness.

Her family lived in Buckholts until she was ready to enter school. They moved to Bartlett when her father took a job as a postal carrier. She attended school in Bartlett where she graduated from high school in 1944.

Jane married Logan Harlan Friedrich on March 29, 1944, after convincing both their fathers that Logan was probably going to be shipped overseas during WWII. Her entire married life of 67 years was spent in Austin, TX.

Jane's first job was at a dress and hat shop owned by Ms. Cole in Bartlett. She worked each summer there during high school. Her job was to "brush the hats and keep them on the stands, clean the shop somewhat, go to the post office, and do all those little odd jobs they wanted me to do." At the end of each summer, she had no money because she spent it all on "really cute" clothes.

After attending a training course, she worked as a court reporter at the Legal Affairs Office at McCloskey General Hospital in Temple, TX. She then worked at Game, Fish and Oyster Commission in Austin, TX, doing typing and office work. She continued with GF&O while it transitioned to Texas Parks and Wildlife and worked as an administrative assistant to the directors (and there were several) of Fisheries and then Wildlife.

The greatest event in her life was when her son, Richard Logan, was born in 1955. The next most exciting times were when she and Logan became proud grandparents to three boys, James Logan, Andrew Michael, and William Pascal. They loved being Grinny and Grandpa and were as involved as they could be, spending countless hours at sporting and Scout events, enjoying weekends at the Friedrich (homestead) farm, etc.

Jane and Logan were active members of Memorial United Methodist Church for many years, since 1957, serving on many committees and in many areas of the church during that time.

She was predeceased by her husband, Logan on May 13, 2011. She is survived by her son, Richard Logan and wife, Judy; sister, Johnnye Gresham; grandsons, granddaughters, and many nieces, nephews and cousins.

intuition were Jerry's superpowers, and he put those to use by recognizing and responding to the needs of those he encountered.

Jerry was born in the small north Texas town of Whitesboro, Texas to Jennie Grace Earnhart and Shelby Eugene Alexander. He was the fourth of five children and often talked about his childhood memories as part of a tightknit pack of kids and going to Lake Texoma in the summers. Jerry was active in athletics throughout middle and high school with a special affinity for basketball.

Jerry attended Austin College in Sherman, Texas where he received a Bachelor's degree in Biology and a Master's degree in Teaching. Later he completed a Master's degree in Counseling. After four years in rural public-school classrooms, he made the leap to higher education when he accepted a position at the University of Texas at Tyler where he led the Career Services Center. He spent the rest of his career serving students in the university setting in New Jersey, Oklahoma, Dallas, and San Antonio. He concluded his career when he retired from the University of Texas at Dallas in 2021 after fourteen years of service. He will forever be rooting for all his former students.

Jerry was the epitome of an adoring and doting husband and father to Jana and Hannah. In addition to his unequivocal love for his girls, he cherished all of the many dog children that passed through his life over the years. Jerry loved travel, reading, talking, French fries, movies, and most of all, people. One of his greatest late life joys was singing in the choir at Memorial United Methodist Church in Austin. Jerry is preceded in death by his parents, Gene and Jennie Alexander; his brother, Bobby Alexander; his sister, Sharion Acker; and a slew of beloved pets. He is survived by his wife and daughter, Jana and Hannah, and two sisters, Marilyn Meals and Susie Meals.



Our budget for this year was agreed to at our spring church council meeting in the amount of \$249,915.00. The budget for 2023 was \$206,378.00. This year we increased our budget in order to help us cover the increase in property insurance, building maintenance and utilities, however, we have not been able to attain property insurance that the finance team thought was a viable option.



A particularly important line item in our budget is something called "apportionments." As a part of the United Methodist connection, the local church, like us, is asked to pay an amount, determined by the conference office. Our apportionments support the district and conference budgets which include ministerial compensation of our conference and district offices, as well as certain ministries beyond the local church like UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief). Apportionments are not a "tax" like something you have to pay the U.S. government yearly; it is a means of supporting the covenant of connection within the United Methodist Church to uphold her mission and ministry. For 2024, the Rio Texas Conference has asked us to pay an apportionment of \$24, 242. MUMC budgeted to pay half of the requested amount this year. As of August, the finance team has paid \$9,000 toward fulfillment of our commitment and we expect to pay our remaining budgeted amount of \$3,000 at the end of December. Thomas G. Harris Elementary school was established in 1954 with eight classrooms. With the passage of a 2 billion dollar bond—the school has been torn down and a new one is being built over the next 1.5 years. In the meantime the kids will go to school at Sims Elementary. The school has been sitting empty for 5 years and is now being cleaned up for the temporary occupancy of the dedicated Harris School staff, teachers and students.

Harris serves approximately 380 students in Early Childhood through fifth grade and offers enrichment classes through the Andy Roddick Foundation program.
