Holding Institute and Good Neighbor Settlement House Receive CWS Blankets



At the end of 2018, Church World Service provided almost 30,000 CWS Blankets to help alleviate suffering in Texas. In partnership with the Rio Texas Conference, almost 12,000 blankets were

distributed through The Holding Institute (Laredo) and Good Neighbor Settlement House (Brownsville). Blankets were also distributed in partnership with Catholic Charities. The total value of the blankets was \$183,580. This type of distribution is made possible through the generosity of thousands of congregations and women's groups such as UMW and Church Women United.

The CWS-United Methodist relationship is very strong. The December, 2018 distribution was coordinated by Susan Hellums, Border Area Mission Coordinator of the El Valle District. CWS has worked through Susan for over 25 years to meet needs in along the border. This July, she will coordinate a visit to the border by CWS fundraising staff (including me!).

“And it came to pass...” (Luke 2a, NKJV)

I can't tell you when exactly it was, though I'm willing to bet the same scene played itself out many times in my life. Kids were getting chosen for some project or team or some such, and I was worried that I hadn't been good enough to merit inclusion. But just when I thought the teacher was done selecting, she/he would say the magic word: “AND...” Hope was reborn!

The Gospel of Luke is full of “AND”, both literally and figuratively. If you took a look at a Greek New Testament, you'll see the word **καί** (“kai”), which is Greek for “and”, a LOT. This has a literary effect of keeping the story

moving, as though you were speaking to someone who was particularly excited about the news that they are telling you and kept going and going and going like a run on sentence because there is just so much Good News to tell!

Luke always has more to say, and he keeps leaning in to the story, pushing you further and further and trying to make sure that you don't miss a single moment. But he pushes us further and further too to consider the other implication of “And”—the figurative one.

Because this Gospel is full of people being added to the Kin-dom of God, so much so that part of what makes the “insiders” so uncomfortable is the inclusion of so many others that they had, with what they thought were excellent reasons, been excluding all this time!

Tax collectors, women and children (whom Luke pays far more attention to than any other Gospel), Samaritans, Gentiles, criminals. They're all there. And in one parable, Jesus asks those surrounding him (some of whom might have even been outsiders themselves!) how they plan to be neighborly to them.

So if you've ever felt left out or if you know someone who has been, if you've ever felt like you haven't been enough or done enough to merit inclusions, if you've been picked on or told you don't belong, I hope you'll come (or invite!) and journey through the Gospel of Luke with us, beginning Sunday, June 16 and going through Sunday, November 3. Along the way, we'll be gathering a whole crowd of the saints as we celebrate Christ's life...and Christ's eternal life.

The Andy Roddick Foundation operates a free six-week summer learning program for Harris elementary students. Part of this program is a partnership with Brighter Bites, a nonprofit focused on increasing access to healthy food for families. Each family that attends the summer program receives 50 servings of fresh produce each week from Brighter Bites. Volunteers support the program by sorting produce and assembling it into bags for the families. Volunteers also have a special opportunity to read with a group of students and receive a brief program tour before starting the Brighter Bites project.
