Pastor's Corner



"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. ² Therefore we will not fear, though the earth

should change,

though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea;

3 though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult." Psalm 46:1-3

Sometimes it feels like everything is changing. Oh wait—it ALWAYS feels like everything is changing...it's just that sometimes it feels quicker than usual!

I saw a tip jar in a restaurant that had the same sign as the jar in the picture above, and I laughed. I thought about what change people wanted to leave behind—and what it might mean to leave change behind. Does that mean you want to go back? Or does that mean you're willing to go forward into an unknown future (which would, of course, imply yet more change)?

Psalm 46 is one of my favorites, probably because in college, I found a musical adaptation which was easy for me to remember and sing over and over again. That was one of my favorite ways to let scripture sink down into my soul—by singing it. (You can listen to the song here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TBXTPHeHkxY)

I found myself singing it the other day and read through the whole psalm again. As I did, I realized that change isn't just something that happens to us because the world is somehow disintegrating (though it feels like that sometimes)—change

happens because that's the way God made the world. People change...creation changes. But we can trust God even in the midst of change!

What changes in your life do you fear? Can you leave the fear behind?

What changes in your life do you embrace? Can you recognize God in the midst of them?

I am grateful that it looks like I will not be experiencing a change this year. For the very first time in my life, it looks like I will get a chance to live in the same house, the same place beyond five years. This staying the same makes me HAPPY! And I also get to move through changes in the church and the neighborhood with you, which makes me happy too.

Our General Conference coming up may bring change to the church as well. That can be very small changes that may not seem to have much effect on our daily life together. Or they may be big changes that have everyone on edge as we try to figure out how to work with them. They may be changes that make us happy. They may be changes that make us angry. Or it may be that there are places where we want change—and either get it or don't. It is a time of uncertainty. But we can be certain that God is and will always be our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Amen.

Did you know if the main account holder on the Austin Energy electric bill in your house is either 65+ or doesn't own/drive a vehicle, you can save some money? There is a "Street Service" charge on your bill that can be waived— it runs anywhere from \$6.50-\$9.78 per month.
