Pastor's Corner

The king and his men marched to Jerusalem against the Jebusites, the inhabitants of the land, who said to David, "You will not come in here,

even the blind and the lame will turn you back"—thinking, "David cannot come in here." ⁷ Nevertheless David took the stronghold of Zion, which is now the city of David. ⁸ David had said on that day, "Whoever would strike down the Jebusites, let him get up the water shaft to attack the lame and the blind..."

(2 Samuel 5:6-8a)

Over the past seven and a half years that I have been at Memorial, we have replaced multiple HVAC systems (culminating with replacing the boiler system which had served the congregation since its move to Berkman Dr), had work done on the roof (with more to come), had sewer pipes replaced and, as of this week, a water heater in the gym. In addition, of course, there have been plenty of minor repairs—fixing ceiling tiles, taking care of leaks, replacing old appliances—in addition to work done to renew and update, as in our gym kitchen and putting the AV systems in the sanctuary.

The Trustees have typically been at the forefront of this work, either doing it themselves in some cases, or at the very least diagnosing the issues, meeting with contractors and closely supervising the work. It's not the kind of thing that gets a lot of kudos or is seen as particularly spiritual.

Except I'm reminded that it is. When David was anointed the king of all of Israel, he wanted to make a statement—he wanted a capital worthy of his position. Jerusalem was thought to be impregnable, but it was held at the time by the Jebusites, an ancient tribe who were original inhabitants in the land of Canaan. The Jebusites were so confident that Jerusalem could not be invaded that they said that even the blind and the lame could repel David's forces.

But Jerusalem's water supply came from outside the walls. The water tunnel system which brought water into the city became David's entry point, allowing him to come into the middle of the city and take the Jebusites by surprise.

Caring for our property and doing things to improve it, does not make it impregnable. It simply reminds us that God makes us of all things to accomplish the purposes of God. It is a part of our work together, and that work is ongoing.



I wonder what work we don't find spiritual but actually is. I wonder how we might be offering Good News through all of our work. I wonder if someone has ever felt welcome at the church because we had a working sink or HVAC or toilet.

In the weeks following the release of this newsletter, I will be releasing a special update on the outcome of our called General Conference. Whatever decisions are made, there will still be a Memorial UMC with a call to offer Good News to our neighbors. I'm grateful that hundreds through the years have experienced the transforming love of Christ both inside and outside of our walls. I am constantly praying that what we do—*everything we do*—allows even more people to experience that.
