- CWS Hygiene Kits collection we'll provide the supplies; walkers will put the kits together and then we'll provide them along the border.



**This section is in honor and memory of our Swedish ancestors.** These recipes were copied form the original cookbook of the woman's Society of Christian service and Wesleyan Service Guild of Memorial United Methodist church of Austin, Texas. The year of our Lord 1964.





Rev. Bent Howe in September 30,1908 arrived in Austin, by train, as the new pastor of Central Methodist Episcopal Church. His arrival made two newspapers, the Austin paper and the Swedish paper. The event drew 400 to 500 people to greet him and his family. One of them was Rev. O. E. Lindstrum who was serving in Georgetown. He would later be the tenth pastor at Central and served between 1926-1928.

In 1870 Swedish immigrants from other states come to Texas. One of them was our founder Carl Charnquist. There were also single young men and women from Sweden. They came with jobs skills. Most came through Chicago ports, then by train to Dallas and completed their journey by stagecoach to Austin.

In the early years they had afternoon service from the people whose job had not allowed them to come to morning services like nurse and governess'. In later years (1990's ) they had early services for people who work on Sunday.

Every year when Lent rolls around my to-do list expands by quite a bit! So when my friend, Ellen, posted this list that her son had written, it unkinked what was getting tighter and tighter in my spirit and reminded me that my own response to being overwhelmed by all the things that I have to do will many times simply cause a shut-down. This kind of to-do list frees me to remember that I am also called, for the sake of my relationship with God, to things that are not a part of my job description!

I am called to Chill! To take Sabbath seriously. To rest. To not need to be in control of everything. To share responsibility and power. To put way my anxiety about the future AND the past and to live in the present moment.

I am called to Explore! To be curious instead of judgmental. To be willing to look at all angles and aspects of a question. To read stories that are outside of my own experience. To wonder about where God is working and to look in unexpected places for signs that God is already there. To wander again around my neighborhood, to meet my neighbors and engage with them.

I am called to Admire! To praise God for all that God has faithfully done in my life and in the lives of others. To live a life of thanksgiving. To speak up where I see beauty and kindness and love. To encourage others when they are doing Good and to see their giftedness. To offer respect when someone is taking on a difficult task.

In the early church, everything was new and exciting and hope-filled. It was also hard and ground-breaking and unpredictable! But I think even our age could use some attention paid to the signs and wonders that God has never stopped doing. How would you go about Chilling, Exploring and Admiring? Let's do that together!
