What's Happening at the Parsonage?

You may not know, but our church has a parsonage, a home where the pastor traditionally lives. Our parsonage, built in 1956, is connected to the southside of our church property by a driveway and chain link fence.

Through the fall of 2023, our Finance Team and Trustees, gathered information from contractors to determine what costs would be involved for much needed repairs to the home and yard. At our annual Church Charge Conference in December, we

approved to take on a loan from The Texas Methodist Foundation to fund the many repairs and much needed renovations in the hope we could recoup our cost within a few years through rental income.



So what work is being done? Upon inspection, it was determined that all plumbing supply lines to the house needed to be replaced; some pipes crumbled even when touched.

All of the electrical outlets needed to be grounded and brought up to code. Essentially the bathrooms and the kitchen were gutted, asbestos removed,

new drywall and cabinets installed. The iron rod door and pillar on the front porch were removed and a new front door installed. All of the molded, inoperable windows have not been replaced yet but will by mid



March. The entire interior and exterior will be painted and after permits are given and final inspections completed, a new HVAC system will be installed. The HVAC work has to wait until all else is complete so we can pursue the Austin Energy

rebate.

We are currently 1 of 3 United Methodist Churches in the district that still maintain a parsonage. Most churches have sold theirs and choose to pay a housing allowance instead.

Please help us extend our gratitude to Kendall Smith for all his efforts to produce the paperwork needed to secure our loan, the contractor as well as

other vendors we have hired. Thank you also goes to Taylor Youngblood and her mom, Barb Pfaff, for all their work on the yard and driveway. We also want to thank Chuck Garner for meeting with the various entities to make sure everything is done correctly.

Please stay tuned for more updates on our website. We should have all the work on the home completed by May.



Prayer... Our Labyrinth

As the song goes, I come to the garden alone, while the dew is still on the roses....

Isn't that the essence of finding peace and comfort with our Lord? Don't we all have a mental image of that place. Maybe a grandparents' garden. Maybe the tended geometric landscaping of a formal palace. Perhaps a grove of olive trees. For me it is a respite, an outdoor sanctuary; protected from the noise of the world, filled with nature's beauty. A place with a winding path that I can follow as meditation.

Memorial United Methodist Church's labyrinth is just that.

Sheltered on three sides by the stone church and shaded by two towering elms it is calm, quiet, cool, and still. Although the path is not a traditional church labyrinth, it was built so that I enter on one side, follow a continuous spiral to the center and out on the other



side. I can see from the outset exactly where it goes, but walk the twisty turns one step at a time. It is a physical metaphor for my walk with Christ. After spending time in contemplation with Him in the center, how could I leave the same way I entered? Like the wise men, I go home in a different way.



To the casual eye, the "garden" is

landscaped in the loosest possible sense of the word. Upon closer study, you find remnants of the hearty dichondra lovingly planted and tended by the founders on this space who imagined it a flat green canvas for church activity. Here and there are native plants that thrive and bloom in the shade on heaven-sent rain. The best of those came up on their own.

Native gardens and groves take a long time to grow into their potential. As teens go through awkward stages, so do gardens. Sometimes Memorial's labyrinth has seemed a little shaggy and unruly. Nurturing the desirable parts while carefully pruning back the troublesome takes discernment and patience.

Luckily the granite gravel path is packed smooth. The few weeds don't get in the way of a meditative stroll. Take a moment to walk it. Listen for the calm still voice of God. Notice the stages and seasons of the garden.

Creating Connection...

At the beginning of Lent we considered what it means to come from dust and return to dust. Some of you may have decided to give up something and to add something to your life in order to be intentional about connecting with God as you consider your mortality and need for God.

What have you chosen to use as a bridge to create connection with God? Or maybe you have noticed God trying to show you a new way to connect as God did with a rainbow in the story of Noah?

In the Church, catechism or confirmation is a means of creating connection. We have 4 youth going through "Confirmation classes" which means they are seeking understanding of what it means to be baptized into the Christian faith and what it means to be a member of the Church, specifically Memorial United Methodist Church.

We are using a book, "The Absolute Basics of the Christian Faith," to help in discussion around things like "What does it mean that God is a Trinitarian God?" or "What does salvation really mean?" We will also use the book, "The Absolute Basics of the Wesleyan Way," to give us an understanding of who John Wesley was and what makes the Methodist denomination different from others.

One of the big differences between Wesleyan theology and other more "reformed" traditions is our belief in "Free Will." We believe God gives us a choice to choose to accept his gift of love and grace. If God didn't, then we would be more like a robot programmed to do only what God wants us to do. We do not believe God has predetermined who is "in or out" of his family. Our belief in Free Will vs Predestination is a "hair's breadth" apart and yet so important to our theological understanding of who we are in light of who God is.

If you would like to know more about what makes us Methodist, please let me know. I'm thinking about having a class on Methodism beliefs. And if you would please be in prayer for our Confirmation mentees and their mentors as they ponder these things: Lucas Benavides with Cliff Masters, Zachary Benavides with Cameron Luecke, Holly Wright with Jana Alexander, and Billie Nixon with Connie Tatom.

In the midst of this Lent, I pray your understanding of God's prevenient, justifying, and sanctifying grace deepens as you grow in love with God and receive God's love for you!

A means of connecting is also through the audio visual system which connects with people online. I'd like to extend thanksgiving to Mark Corry for helping us reconnect after our break in in August and his continuing to get resources for our church as needed. Thank you to John Adams, Kendall Smith, Taylor Youngblood and everyone who has helped in the A/V box for worship services.
