But now, says the LORD—
the one who created you, Jacob,
the one who formed you, Israel:
Don't fear, for I have redeemed you;
I have called you by name; you are mine. (Isaiah 43:1)

These are pictures of kākāpō. Kākāpō are extremely endangered, green, rotund, flightless parrots only found on a couple of island sanctuaries south of New Zealand. Today, there are just under 200 adults left in the world, though that's up from fewer than 70 in the 90's! And they just went through a breeding season that produced what we hope will be around 45 chicks that will survive into adulthood.



I have followed the kākāpō conservation efforts for several years now, though I was introduced to the bird in the early 90s through Douglas Adams' book *Last Chance to See*. There are so few of them that each of them is known by a name. The one looking up at the intruder in her nest as she's sitting on a clutch of eggs is Queenie, and the one at the bottom showing his full glory is Sirocco—who, having unfortunately bonded with humans as a chick, is now almost exclusively used as a spokesbird for the species.

Other than my fascination with what are affectionately termed "moss chickens", I keep thinking about the names. Margaret-Maree, Zephyr, Solstice, Gulliver, Juanma, Komaru—there's even a Wikipedia page that is kept up-to-date with all of the deaths and the family trees of each of the birds—and all of those names!

It's not so much the mix of names (which are sometimes clustered around a type like Zephyr, whose progeny are all named after winds, or are names of significance to the keepers or the indigenous Māori people) as the fact that they *all have a name*. There are people who care so much about these birds and keeping them alive for generations to come that they take the time to call each of them by a name, which is carefully chosen for them on their first birthday (before they are known by their mother's name and hatching order).

And then I think, "God has the same care for us as the keepers do with the kākāpō!" Even though there are infinitely more of us, God knows our names. And God knows them because God cares for us and redeems us from all that might keep us from God's love.

It makes a difference to me when someone knows or remembers my name *and* that I don't generally go by Cindy or another nickname. I wonder what a difference it would make with both people we see every day and people we only meet once to know that we are speaking to a person whose name God knows. That God cares for them too. In a world where some names have been turned into expletives or codes for



horrible sayings, maybe that would be a start to remembering that God is in our midst and is looking for us to respond out of love and hope that all might come out of fear and into the light of God's redeeming love.
