




2024 the Year of Green for MUMC

Raise the Roof



Some of our flat roof has been replaced! The angled roof was replaced in 2022. Our flat roof replacement is TPO, Thermoplastic Polyolefin, a single-ply roofing membrane that is one of the fastest-growing commercial roofing systems on the market. It is white so it reflects sun more which will provide energy savings. There are less seams, so it's sturdier and better insulated. It's like having a bathtub on these flat roof portions. Not all the flat roof has been updated yet. We'll keep you posted on the rest.

With Love from your Pastor

It has been said, "April Showers brings May flowers." It has been a lovely spring with many rain showers and oh, so many wildflowers, butterflies and cooler days!

In May, as we consider this month of transition from the coolness of spring to summer sun, let us also choose to

consider what we might do to learn more about mental health and advocate for people with mental health conditions or acute mental illness.

In 1949, congress set aside May as Mental Health Awareness month. Although it has been 70+ years since our government was intentional about bringing this issue to the forefront in the public domain, there is still a stigma and misunderstanding surrounding mental health and mental illness. Did you know 1 in 4 people live with a mental health condition?

I was a part of a leadership team for a women's retreat in 2023 in which I prayed and pondered how my testimony has been impacted by mental health conditions. After sharing what I had learned, I sensed God nudging me to ask if anyone wanted to pray for themselves or loved ones. Women started asking for prayers for husbands with addictions, for siblings with severe bipolar disorder, children with anxiety and ADHD or for themselves as they struggled with depression. We ended up praying for almost two hours and it led me to volunteer in mental health organizations like NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) and to work on a dissertation focused on how a church can embrace people impacted by mental illness.

Some may see symptoms like over sleeping, over eating or not eating patterns, isolating or having fits of rage, self destructive habits or gloomy disposition and wonder if its serious **enough to do anything about. If one's behavior hinders them from daily activities over a period** beyond two weeks, they need to consider seeing a counselor to at least have a consultation. There is a range of mental health conditions that can be acute mental illnesses. Some require **medication and some do not. It's ok to not be ok! It's ok to ask for help! You are not alone!**

If you get a broken arm, you need to go to the doctor and so it is with a mental health condition. Please join in the conversations and prayer for yourself or others you know. You can get a counselor through psychologytoday.org. There are support groups and tools we can share to give each other support. Jesus came to heal the sick, body, mind and spirit.
