

The year that C.S. Lewis' book, "The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe" came to our local movie theaters, I used a character illustration from the movie in a sermon. A women in my congregation who had an 8-year-old son came up to me and said, "I was thinking about taking him to see it, but do you think it would be okay?"

I had seen the movie, and I found that for all of the action sequences and battle scenes, it wasn't gory. I had been about 8 when I read the book and saw the cartoon. Knowing the story and knowing that they could have made things much more intense, I said, "Sure, I think he could handle it - there's some action stuff, but it isn't bad or bloody."

I forgot. I knew the story. I knew how it ended.

SPOILER ALERT!! If you don't know the story and want to read it for yourself, don't read any farther.

The next week, they came back to church and the mother came up to me and said, "You forgot to tell us that Aslan dies. He got so upset we had to leave the theater for a bit."

Aslan - the not-tame lion of the book. If the book is read as allegory (which C.S. Lewis clearly meant it to be), Aslan is a Christ-figure. And toward the end of the book, Aslan is killed by the forces of evil, while two of the young girls in the book were nearby listening.

I was horrified, and I quickly asked if they had gone back in to see the rest of it. She said that she had been able to coax him back into the theater in time to see that Aslan had come back to life because of the "deeper magic" that meant that even the forces of evil could not hold him back. The mother assured me that her son was okay, and I talked a little bit with him to make sure.

But afterward, I got to thinking about it. I wished I had been that boy at Easter. That boy knew how the disciples and followers of Jesus felt as they watched him arrested, beaten and crucified. They knew the shock and horror... but they also knew the outlandish, impossible joy of finding out that he was, against all logic, alive.

As we go into Easter, I pray that you catch ahold of not only the joy, but also "the rest of the story". We rest on all of it - not just some of it. Jesus' life...and death...and resurrection. We'll see you in worship!
