> We are down in worship attendance so far this year by an average of 8 every month. It's just one of the measures we use, but it can help us to remember that **we need to invite people to worship if we want them to attend**. Inviting is a part of our culture that we need to recapture. Look what we did during Holy Week - all of those numbers were up from last year!

Financial giving January - March: \$48,410 Expenses January - March: \$55,283

> So...this tells our finance committee that we need to look at how we can continue to raise funds to meet our expenses. And it might tell you **that the church could really use your help in meeting our budget for ministry and mission**. This is especially important in the summer when giving typically drops - remembering the church *every month* helps to keep us going!

As I write this, it's mid-April, and the blooms are just coming out on our Easter lilies.

Easter lilies? Aren't we done with that?

The blooms on the plants that we have in our sanctuary on Easter Sunday fade quickly. We purchased those lilies on the Tuesday before Easter, and many of the blooms that were perky then had to be dead-headed before worship on Sunday morning. Though beautiful, the bloom of the lily is not as long-lasting as we hope.

So why am I talking about blooming lilies? How do we go from short-lived potted plant to blooming, year after year, living and green?

Every year, after Easter, most of the lilies that have been given in honor or memory of someone are picked up and taken home. Sometimes people donate them back to the church to go to shut ins - or it's like this year when we had only lilies that had already given up all their blooms left.

But sometimes we plant them. There are some in one of the planter boxes in the courtyard right now. They take root and then the lilies live on to bloom year after year, offering fragrant flowers.



It's like a bonus Easter.

Our spiritual lives are like that too - we can have this awesome, glorious experience that comes from Easter Sunday, but unless we get rooted and stay with it, the gift we've been given just withers and fades. But if we get "planted", our roots begin to establish connection, get fed and we stay alive, year after year.

How do you get planted at Memorial UMC? Why not try a Bible study, Sunday School class or helping out with Prayground? We'll have some opportunities for short-term projects, like Vacation Bible School. There's involvement with our community partners - like Faith in Action Caregivers or Windsor Park Neighborhood Association. And there's always United Methodist Women or any of our wonderful musical ensembles and even a simple daily commitment to pray for our ministry.

So get planted...get rooted in the body of Christ. And bring on Easter all over again.
