Pastor Harris Accepts New Appointment

This letter was e-mailed to members on April 7. Dear Friends in Christ,

Last Thursday, Sheree and I were asked by Bishop Jim Dorff and the Cabinet (the District Superintendents) of the Southwest Texas Conference to move in June to new appointments in the Conference. After two days of prayer and deliberation, we agreed to follow the leading of the Holy Spirit and move to these new appointments. On Tuesday evening, I was introduced as the pastor of St. Luke UMC in San Angelo, and Sheree was introduced as the associate pastor at First UMC in San Angelo.

These are not moves that we necessarily anticipated this year, but United Methodist clergy are appointed to serve in their churches for only one year at a time. So a move is possible any year during our active ministry. We move at the direction of our Bishop and Cabinet, and we are committed to this process.

I want you to know that I count it an honor and privilege to have served with you in ministry as your pastor these last five years. We have shared much and been richly blessed by God's love and grace. I look forward to these next weeks as we celebrate Easter and continue to reach out with God's love to all in northeast Austin.

In the coming days, the Bishop and Cabinet will consult with Memorial's Staff Parish Relations Committee and appoint a new pastor. I am sure that your new pastor will be a great blessing to your lives and lead you into God's future for Memorial.

I ask that you begin to pray today for everyone involved in this transition for Memorial Church. May all that we do strengthen the church and give glory to God


