Gathering at 7:00pm in our parlor for an intimate worship experience.



## April/ May Missions Project



Shoes for Redemptive Work

Did you know that every year, over 600 *million* shoes are thrown into landfills? These shoes contain many materials that become toxic as they breakdown in the environment.

We will be collecting gently worn shoes in bags of 25 pairs each at the church in April and May. This is a project that is being run through Redemptive Work, an organization that helps people who are traditionally considered unemployable with coaching and opportunities to find a pathway to sustainable employment. Your shoes (and your neighbors' shoes!) can help like this:

- 1. We fill bags—25 pairs of shoes per bag. These bags are taken to Redemptive Work.
- 2. Redemptive Work gathers all the bags and receives \$.40/pound from an organization that will ship the shoes to places in the developing world.
- 3. Redemptive Work uses the money to train and hire people who would otherwise be stuck in the poverty cycle (providing jobs!).
- 4. The shoes go to places where shoes are needed. People are hired to repair shoes that can be repaired as well as to break shoes into their component parts which can be used in other goods and items. Microeconomies are created in developing nations (providing jobs!).
- 5. The landfill doesn't get filled as quickly. The land is not polluted.

EVERYONE WINS! In April, we will be handing out bags and rubber bands (to band the shoes you collect together). Return all your bags to the church by May 18 so that we can get them to Redemptive Work.

### **Pastor's Corner**

As we move through Lent and approach Easter, I find myself once again in that strange mix of places. In the present, I am journeying through Lent, much the same way most people are—looking with more seriousness at the ways in which I have sinned and fallen short of God's hopes for me, trying to repent and fall on God's grace. This is not just what I do for a season—nor should any of us, as if once Easter comes, we're free to then go back to life as we were accustomed, sinning because it's easier in many ways than a life of following Christ. Lent should be a time of setting our life in a direction that's more consistent with the Good News gift we've been given.

But I'm also preparing for Easter with resurrection and all that joy on my mind. I find myself distracted by thoughts of Alleluias ringing through the air, lilies in full bloom perfuming the sanctuary, the proclamation that Christ is RISEN! It is easier and more fun for me to move to the joy, though there are still 4 weeks left in Lent.

What distracts your spiritual life? Some people get distracted by the part that says "Christ will come again." I was driving to Dallas this week and saw a sign that said "8/2/2027 Christ stands on Mt. Olivet at NOON". The amount of time that this billboard and the accompanying website must take in someone's life is incredible to me. Some people are distracted by a preoccupation with Jesus' suffering and death. Some, like me, want to live more constantly in the joy.

The gift for me of this season in which I am present with all three of the statements above is that I have to learn to hold all of them simultaneously. I can't so concentrate on Jesus' death on a cross for me and for my salvation that I don't remember that his resurrection is ongoing as well. I can't get so caught up in the resurrection that I don't pay attention to the injustices going on around me—injustices I am called to cry out against and work alongside the Holy Spirit and others to end. I can't get caught up in Christ's return, though I must remember that we look for that day and prepare for it by learning to live in the kingdom that Jesus describes in the Gospels...the kingdom that will be "on earth as it is in heaven."

My prayers are with this congregation as it learns to live in the midst of all kinds of things that distract us... things we have to learn how to do simultaneously. Our witness is that most of this is impossible, except that Christ is with us, helping to make us whole. May you have a blessed Lent...and a joyous Easter!
