Changes in the Southwest Texas and

Rio Grande Annual Conferences

The Southwest Texas Annual Conference (our conference) and Rio Grande Annual Conference (our sister, Spanish - language-based conference) are seeking unification. We will be voting on unification at our Annual Conferences in June and the Jurisdictional Conference (the conferences from Nebraska, Kansas, Missouri, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Texas, and New Mexico), meeting in July 2012).

Unification is a long process of deciding how to bring ministries, churches and clergy together in the healthiest and most faithful way. The working groups from both conferences are soliciting feedback from members of congregations in both conferences. They have set up information sessions that will also be an opportunity for members of churches to provide feedback and items for the working groups to consider.

Austin District FreeStore: The Christmas Version Saturday, December 10

When the fires broke out in Bastrop County, the Austin District responded. We already had a FreeStore (a district sponsored event meant to help low-income families "shop" for their children's needs) planned to help one elementary school in Smithville, one of the communities affected by the fires. But we immediately knew the need in both elementary schools would be great so we decided to expand!

You can help by bringing an unwrapped toy (around \$25) to the church before December 5. And it doesn't even have to be from you - if you have a neighbor or a friend who you would like to invite to participate, that would be great! Our district has a goal of 500 toys, and we want to be a part of helping Christmas come, especially for kids and families who may have lost everything without the means to replace it.

Christmas Offering

One of the most successful pastors in our denomination reminds his parishoners every year that "Christmas is not your birthday". Churches of every size from small to mega throughout the country are beginning to commit each December to making sure that giving to "our own" does not far outweigh giving to others.

Each year we invite you as a part of Memorial UMC to give to our missional outreach. This year, we would like to challenge you to think about at least tithing (giving 10%) from your gifts to others to the church. For example, if your gift budget for Christmas is \$500 for your friends and family, consider giving \$50 to the church above and beyond your regular offerings.

Going a step further, you could even consider giving a gift to someone by sponsoring a ministry at the church! \$10-\$20 would help us provide space for a Boy Scout meeting or ESL class, \$50-\$75 would provide a meal following a funeral or enough copies of an anthem for the choir, \$100 supports a camp scholarship, or \$300 helps cover the cost of adult Sunday School curriculum for three months.

Whatever you can do, remembering that "Christmas is not your birthday" helps us to remember that participating in the missions and ministries of the church honors Christ, whose birthday we are celebrating. Mark your special gifts "Christmas" and turn them in either through the offering or in the office.

By my calculations, we have 38 days from the day I write this to Christmas Day. Five Sunday's. One major holiday weekend. A few scattered meetings and parties already on the calendar. Who knows how many hours of cleaning to make our home ready for the quests we hope to entertain.

We measure time with watches and clocks - precision calculated if we can get it. We have just changed our clocks so that we might have more daylight in the early waking hours. But the number of minutes of daylight each day are still growing fewer and fewer.

Time.

It will fly by for me with so much to do - for there are still sermons to be written, worship services to plan for, visits to be made, forms to fill out and prayers to be prayed.

I wonder if Mary felt the time flying by, especially there toward the end. I wonder if she longed for a few more hours to get things done, preparations made. Surely she was praying for more time as she and Joseph journeyed to Bethlehem - more time to get there before the baby came.

I am sure the Magi were time-measurers, time-counters. They saw the passage of time as moving them ever closer to the star, were able to see progress every day.

There are many, though, for whom these days will move slowly—they will not have the same kind of busy-ness to fill them. They may be closer to the shepherds, each day seemingly like the next, the only passage of time being the movement of the flock from one pasture to another, the coming of night and the dawning of day.

And then God breaks into Time. I pray that this season, whether you are busy or whether your days are long and very much the same, that you will stop in wonder at the moments that God breaks into your busy-ness...or into the loneliness...or both.

May the Christ Child find you - and all who need his Coming - all in his Good Time.
