

In the Gospel of John, right after Jesus feeds thousands with two fish and five loaves of bread, the people realize that he and his disciples have taken off in a boat. They go around to the other side of the sea to find him and then (seemingly nonchalantly to my ears) say, "Oh, Rabbi, when did you come here?" As if they didn't go all the way around or get in their own boats to follow him.

Jesus sees through this. He says, essentially, "You didn't come here to see me. You came here to see if I could do another miracle with food."

But I think in his next words, he recognizes their situation. They are hungry, and he knows they will always be hungry. But he knows that he can give them so much more than bread day after day. He can really feed them.

What does it mean to feed people? When you have someone who comes to you and gets one meal a day, food is something we are compelled by the Gospel to provide. When children are doing poorly in school because they aren't getting the nutrition they need, that's an issue that we have to address.

But for those of us with access to 3 or more meals a day, what bread can Jesus give us? What bread can we offer those who seemingly have all the bread they need?

In conversation with both the worship committee and the church council, on Labor Day weekend, our congregation will show up to worship ready to feed people. We will hear scripture and pray and share communion together, but the rest of our morning will be spent in service. Part of that will be actually feeding - getting bags of cookies to various people who serve us but can't be in worship on Sunday morning like the fire department down the street, the EMS station, volunteers and staff at Ronald McDonald House and nurses on duty at Dell Children's.

But we'll also be doing several other things - "feeding" people in other ways. Below, you'll see a list of projects we'll have set up. Some will help us get out of the building. Some will allow you to simply move to the parlor to be in mission. If you are interested in helping to coordinate one of these areas, please contact the office (452-5796).

As a congregation, we can use the gift of faith to serve - to offer all sorts of food to those who are hungry. And in doing so, we might just find that Jesus is feeding us too. See you in worship. Bring friends!

Cookies for Those Who Serve: We minister by baking, packaging or delivering cookies to our fire department, EMS and more!

Prayer Walk: We minister through prayer as we walk around Harris to offer prayer for the school year.

Appreciation Bags for Harris Teachers: We minister by preparing tokens of thanks for the hard work our teachers do. These will be taken to the school on Tuesday, September 4.

Letters to our Wesley School: One of our goals is to invite parents and families from our Wesley School to get involved at Memorial. We minister by writing a note or postcard to a family to thank them for being a part of the Wesley and inviting them to come and be a part of our congregation too.

Bags for Homeless: We minister by putting together bags of useful items for those who are in need. We provide the supplies - you help put them together and consider taking some to distribute.

Thank to everyone for their participation in preparing school kits for UMCOR. At the School of Christian Missions in Kerrville, units brought 1,324 kits and donated nearly \$3800 for shipping and donation to UMCOR. Memorial sent 5 completed bags, supplies for more bags and a number of empty bags which were filled with supplies on site.

Alberta and the girls enjoyed their four days at the SCOM. Alberta taught the course on the book "Immigration and the Bible". Pastor Cynthia is teaching it in the North Texas Conference. The two of them will work together to bring this course to the church in the Spring. We had originally planned to do this in October, but it is too complicated to limit to one Saturday morning. Plans are underway to do the Haiti study in October. Alberta said it was sort of sad to attend the last West Gulf Regional School as that format will change under the new organization and to attend the last School of Christian Missions.

There will be information on the UMW Board about all the changes coming up. We are no longer to be called a local unit. We are the Organization of UMW in the Church. There will be no School of Christian Missions, but it will be called Mission u. The Women's Division no longer exists as part of the general Board of Global Ministries and will exist separately and on its own.
