

His parents are Jonathan and Sarah Martinez. He has a brother Carter age 4 and sister Isabella age 18 months and all are so proud!





Girl Scout Troops from all around Austin participate in this event every year. Juliette Gordon Low, who founded the Girl Scout movement in the United States, died of breast cancer in 1927 at a time when cancer and breasts were not talked about in polite society. Her illness

was kept a secret, and even Girl Scouts did not learn about it until 1996. To honor her memory and to pay tribute to today's breast cancer patients and survivors, every fall the Walnut Creek Service Unit holds this event.

While everyone has fun making bracelets, we also use the time to educate girls and parents about the signs of breast cancer and how to catch it early through self-exams and

mammograms. Early detection is the key! We also encourage girls to feel more comfortable talking about an uncomfortable issue. This is the third year that Troop 172 has planned and coordinated Pink Beads of Love.

Pastor's Corner



Change is coming!

For more than a year now, the traffic on Berkman Drive (in front of the church) has been steadily

increasing. Because of the way our entrance drive misaligns with Wheless Drive across Berkman, we've had to play an odd dance of left turns, trying to go around each other. This has led to backups and the occasional accident not to mention flared tempers and impatience as people behind the turning cars have driven in front of bicyclists and even come out to find that cars were stopped, not to turn, but because of kids crossing the street.

It's a mess, and when the city approached us wanting to solve the problem, we entertained many ideas, including reversing the flow of traffic around the church. What we finally settled on is that the city would pay to have a new drive put in so that you can enter the church directly opposite Wheless (see drawing below). While the construction is going on, we will still be able to use the old drive and then when it's done, they will fill in the old drive with grass.


This change seems small and likely to solve far

more problems than it creates, but I know that for some folks, it will seem difficult or unnecessary.

Sometimes change happens when we are simply trying to figure out what we need to do next (change "on the fly"). Sometimes change is the result of a lot of work and looking at possibilities and outcomes (planned change). We experience both here at Memorial UMC. Some changes are painful, as we can look at the pews and see where our friends used to sit—friends who have moved away or are now homebound or who have died. Some changes are joyful, as with the Undersized Usher Crew that we have had for the past couple of months during the offering time!

God works change in us as well. When we allow God to do this, our spirits are more malleable—they turn more easily toward God...and they turn more easily toward others. While many of the changes in our country have hardened people into their ideological/political/theological positions, what change might God work in us that will allow us to keep our eyes on Jesus, turning and following him wherever he leads? That requires some flexibility. And it requires us to see God, even in the small change of a new driveway. May you enter our space and know that the Lord is here.
