



Stories from Austin During World War II

Speaking of People by Marceline Townsley Austin American Statesman Jan. 16, 1944 Retold by Gloria McPhail

A senior hostess at the recreation center for servicemen at the Central Methodist Church Mrs. Peterson, decided to send Christmas cards to the parents of the serviceman. The City of Austin, civil organizations, business' and Churches had programs for the servicemen and their dependents.

Little is written about the programs for the parents of the servicemen and women. We do know that one of the mothers of a servicemen, Mrs. Boomhower from N. Y., wrote back thanking Mrs. Peterson for the card. She included a five- dollar bill with a request that a birthday cake with 21 candles be furnished for her son's birthday in January. She had just gotten over the flu and with the mail being so slow, she did not think it would get there in time. Mrs. Peterson and other hostesses threw a surprise party using the good china. Mrs. Mabray baked the requested 'big white cake with 21 candles'. It was a hallmark moment and the birthday boy played the violin at the party.

Austin Hosts Thousands of Servicemen

During War World II on the weekends Austin hosted between 12,000 and 22,000 service personnel. The USO, Austin city government, civil organizations, business', churches, universities and citizens helped house, feed and entertain these servicemen.

Housing- The government gave the serviceman housing vouchers for them to use in private homes and churches. Sometimes they were double booked. The Southern Presbyterian Church opened its doors but needed 40 more sets of bedding. It was impossible to buy the these items at the time. The university gave them cotton and the church members bought or gave the rest of the materials needed. They made 80 quilts in about three days!

Food- The USO and the church provided home cooked refreshments, snacks, picnic and sack lunches and also monthly dinners. Central Methodist Church served fried chicken, Swedish meatballs, Swedish rye bread, scalloped potatoes, combination salads, apple and lemon pie.

Entertainments- The churches had birthday parties, picnics, trips to ranches with real cowboys, sing-a-longs and old-fashioned parlor games. Central Methodist Church had musical entertainment and provided musical instruments for the servicemen to play. The USO had raffles tickets for the U.T. and A&M football game and long distances phone calls. The above facts were gathered from the internet and the newspapers.

"Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also the fish, as much as they wanted." John 6:11

Throughout the scriptures Jesus sets forth the example of giving thanks before he

shares what he has been given to eat. God is worthy of our praise and shows us the importance of having a grateful heart.

In the story of feeding the 5,000 in the Gospel of John, Jesus asked Philip where they should buy bread for the large crowd that had followed him and the disciples. Philip said, "Six months wages would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little." Then Andrew noted that a little boy had 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish, and yet this wouldn't be enough.

Jesus gave thanks and encouraged the act of sharing. Could it be that in the sharing of the bread and fish of this little boy, it was the catalyst for others sharing what they had? Once the sharing began, it seemed there was more than enough. When all were satisfied, they even discovered there were leftovers. There were twelve baskets of leftovers. It was a sign of God's miraculous presence. What if in our gratefulness for what God has given us, God multiplied our gifts to be distributed among us as we shared?


