

Pastor's Corner September 2014

I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. Ephesians 1:17-19

I am so full.

It isn't even Thanksgiving yet.

During the week of writing this newsletter article, I have been participating in Truck by Truckwest, which is a "trailer crawl". I have a pass that allows me to get samples from about 60 food trucks all across Austin. These samples range from the truly sample-size (a couple of bites), to an entire half a subway sandwich or full taco. The food truck scene is so diverse, in both its flavors and its approaches. Thus, after visiting over half of the trucks (Ed: as of Monday morning, we got to 47 of them), I am full *and* I have a fridge full of leftovers!

But I'm full for a lot of other reasons.

I'm full because ministry is beginning to take on a new shape at Memorial. Ministry not just with those who are "already in", but ministry with those who don't belong anywhere. Ministry that reaches out in so many different ways to our neighborhood community through partnership with many organizations.

My heart swells when a diverse group of people gathers for Bible study or for our BRUNCH series. It grows larger when I get to talk to people in the community and tell them that I'm not just doing this because I'm a nice person, but because I'm a Jesus person. It almost bursts when I hear about experienced members and new-to-us members talking about how they can further ministry on their own. It dances when people call me to tell me their stories about how God has been moving, stretching them to grow and doing things they might not have risked before for the sake of the Good News.

The participants at MUMC are *not* all the same. We have different abilities, different backgrounds, different gifts. Some have the ability to write a check. Some don't have the ability to get a meal on a regular basis. Some have PhD's. Some did not finish high school. And yet, every week as the saints below gather (probably with a few saints above looking on as witnesses), I see God molding and shaping and bringing out the best in people.

The verse from Ephesians I quoted above has been with me. I am experiencing the HOPE to which we are all called. And this is the result of that verse:

And [God] has put all things under [Jesus'] feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, ²³ which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

You are God's fullness. Thank you.

Community Partners

Did you know that Memorial UMC now has **NINE** community partners? In December we will welcome the Texas-Louisiana regional office for Church World Service. You may know them best from CROP WALK, but they are involved all over the world, alleviating hunger and providing emergency relief. Welcome CWS!

Our current partners are:

- Drive a Senior—provides rides to seniors who need to get to a doctors appointment. To volunteer as a driver, call 512-459-1122.
- Austin Children's Theater (ACT)—we provide space for their summer camp and sometimes for productions and school-year courses.
- Austin Ukelele Society—They rehearse every second Thursday in our gym. All talent levels welcome! Join in the fun!
- Boy Scout Troop _____- They meet on Monday nights in the gym at 7:30. If you know of a boy between 11 and 18 who would like to join, call Scout Master, Bobby Kent at 512-577-5523.
- Meals on Wheels—We serve as a distribution point for 27 different meal routes in northeast Austin. To volunteer for a route, either daily or as needed, call 512-476-MEAL(6325).
- Windsor Park Neighborhood Association (WPNA)—Meets on the second Saturday of every month in the Faith, Hope and Love classroom off of the gym. Discusses issues relevant to the neighborhood.
- Achieve School—a junior high charter school, Achieve uses our gym on Monday-Wednesday for their sports teams as their campus on Manor undergoes a transformation with permanent buildings.
- Harris Elementary—as our partnership grows, we are looking to ways that we can help the parents of students. You will be hearing more about these possibilities soon!
