In this spirit, Pastor Cynthia wanted to share with you a special resource for your prayer life. In 2001, the Episcopal Church of St. John the Baptist in Lodi, CA, started summarizing the international news for the week and offering prayers based on that news. They offered these prayers within their congregation and then, through the web, to the world.




Today, a volunteer task force whose members take turns writing, posts the prayers on worldinprayer.org each Thursday (they can sometimes be late because the prayer team consists of writers from three different countries, two continents and a half dozen different denominations). You may also sign up to receive the prayers by email.

These prayers will invite you to pray for the whole world and expand your understanding of how God so loved the WORLD that he gave his only Son. They may also help you to read your newspaper or watch the news differently, shaping you to spend time in prayer first when you hear a story that makes you hopeful or angry.
