Walk dogs or play with cats at the Austin Animal Center (check their website for volunteer information)


During that week, if we have a card for you and your project, we will mail you a very short survey that can help us to tell the stories. Bring that back



"Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again." -- "Memorial Acclamation", *United Methodist communion liturgy*

I have been contemplating this line from our communion liturgy now for several months, mostly because I attended two worship services within a couple of months (in other places) where they got the words wrong. They used a past tense instead of a present tense and the line read: "Christ has died, Christ has risen, Christ will come again."

It's an easy enough mistake to make since *has* and *is* sound similar enough. And doesn't it make sense to say that Christ has risen?—I mean, there aren't any stones rolled away today. This event did happen in the past.

But there's so much more to it than that.

In this world, the headlines mostly seem to be bleaker every time we look. I actually don't think that's anything new—I think that we have improved our ability to get information out such that we hear almost instantly of a bomb or an attack or a scandal or an inflammatory speech or a shooting or a natural disaster. We live not only our own experiences but the experiences of the entire rest of the world.

That should be enough to convince us of the reality of sin.

It's also enough to lead us into despair, to long to "return to the good old days" (before Adam and Eve ate?). We believe that the "good days" are all in the past.

But here's what our statement says: "Christ IS risen." Not has, IS. It's a small distinction, but incredibly important. Christ IS risen to be in the midst of the disaster. Christ IS risen to be in the midst of our struggles. Christ IS risen to be with the poor. Christ IS risen to be with those who suffer and mourn. Christ IS risen. Today. Now. Even in the midst of what looks so messed up we don't know how it can be redeemed.

Rich Mullins, in his last album, wrote:

"Time cannot contain You. You fill eternity.

Death can never stain You. Death has lost its sting.

And I cannot explain how You came to love me,

except to say that nothing is beyond You" ("Nothing Is Beyond You")

If we have this assurance that Christ IS risen and is able to work all of these things in us, we need to say with assurance that Christ IS risen in this world. That nothing is beyond the power of Christ. That death may be our past, but Christ IS our present and our future. This is not just a line in the middle of communion. This is life for those who see only death and Good News for those who have only heard the bad.

Whatever tragedy comes, we can state clearly, "Christ IS risen." And then we can get to work, being the embodiment of the Risen Christ in the midst of the brokenness. So don't simply add to the brokenness, thinking that by somehow doing that, you can get back to the past. Christ IS risen. Here. Now. For you. For me. For everyone. Amen.
