

**Robert Malcolm
Compton**

May 15, 1946 - July 31, 2019

Robert (Bob) Malcolm Compton (73) of Pflugerville, Texas passed away on July 31st, 2019. He was born on May 15th, 1946 in Dallas, Texas.

Bob graduated Big Spring High School in 1964 and then the family moved to Austin, TX. In 1965, Bob was drafted into the U.S. Air Force and served until May of 1969. During that time he attained the rank of Staff Sargent and served one tour in Vietnam during the war.

After his service in the U.S. Air Force, he returned to Austin, TX. He then married Maureen Ott and had his first daughter Atesha Monteen Compton. In 1970, he began his career with the State of Texas working to implement Texas' first food stamp program for those who needed assistance. At the same time, his love of flying encouraged him to share his passion and teach others how to fly small personal aircraft. Bob's career with the State of Texas spanned 34 years. He served various roles within Health and Human Services including working to ensure those with disabilities had access to equal opportunities.

In 1978, he remarried to Barbara Jean Wilson, daughter of Cleo Wilson. Together, they had their son Chris Compton and daughter Jennifer Jo Compton whom were active at Memorial.

In 1985, Bob began his battle with cancer when he was diagnosed with Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma. In 1989, it came back aggressively and almost took his life. His will to survive outweighed the disease that was trying to bring him down. This mentality helped him persevere multiple health and emotion struggles

with a positive outlook.

Bob and Barbara were each other's champions and strength as they each battled cancer. Even in their own times of pain, they always ensured the kids and family were well taken care of and loved. Bob loved his whole family and embraced everyone he met. He never met a stranger and always wore a smile.

He always loved the Lord and after Barbara passed away in 2012 his relationship with God gave him strength. This love of God and his church led him to Israel in 2018 so he could be baptized in the River Jordan.

Bob is preceded in death by his mother Maxine, father Tommy Jo, sister Suzanne, wife Barbara and daughter Jennifer Jo. He is survived by brother David Compton and wife Katherine, daughter Atesha and granddaughter Iris; son Chris and wife, Emily, granddaughter Etta and grandson Jonas Estrada; numerous aunts, nieces, nephews, cousins and loved ones.

Bob was a passionate supporter of multiple charities that focused research and support of cancer patients. In lieu of flowers, please consider a contribution to a cancer charity of your choice.

Bob was a special person whom we admired and will be missed by friends, family and Memorial.

Volunteer Training Opportunity

Memorial UMC is always looking for volunteers to help with our children, youth, and adult

ministries. Because the safety and well-being of every vulnerable person is important, our Trustees adopted a Child/Youth/Vulnerable Adult Safety Policy, and this policy requires that anyone who wants to work with one of those groups must complete the Trusted con Confianza Safety Certification process. This includes a background check, a pre-recorded online training, and a live training that can be done in person or online. The cost of this training is between \$10 and \$20, but the church will gladly pay this fee for anyone who asks. The training will only take a few hours, but the certification is good for two years. CHURCH WORLD SERVICE

I did not submit an article for the August NL. July was a very busy month. Included in the busy-ness was a week working in the Valley.

With staff fundraising colleagues from around the U.S., we were based in McAllen; visited with Church World Service partners who are on-the-ground; sleeves rolled up; hearts and hands open; ministering to refugees, asylum-seekers and migrants who have crossed the border. My heart broke, looking into the exhausted eyes of barely school-age children. Children with deep, dark circles under their eyes. My heart soared when I saw those same children and their families carrying CWS blankets with them.

I have to tell you the stories are difficult to hear: mothers who have to give their daughters (as young as 10 and 11) birth control pills because of the danger of rape. Mothers placing themselves between harm and their kids. Politics aside, this is a tremendous humanitarian crisis; people are suffering; and the Church is responding. Children are being separated from parents; the Church is helping as many of those kids as possible with legal representation, love and support.

We heard from Justice For Our Neighbors (JFON), which is a UM ministry. The rules used to apply immigration law for asylum seekers, refugees and migrants seemingly change by the week. It is extremely difficult for the “experts” of JFON to keep up with these changes. Think about reading the “terms and conditions” for your credit card or most any other “legalese.” That’s what it’s like for people both seeking to enter the US and who have been granted temporary legal status.

And so my heart aches. And my soul gives thanks to God, who has given us Jesus Christ, our teacher, our brother and our Redeemer. There are so many along the border doing as much good as they can for all the people they can. I urge you to be a part of that work.

"Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law." (Romans 13:10)

Fear. It's out there.

I'm not just talking about slasher flicks or Halloween houses. I'm talking about our daily news, our daily lives, the web articles we read because a loved one posted them or forwarded them to us. On the radio, every day more sensationalized than the last.

Fear is a great tool to make people do what you want. I have been horribly disappointed to see important debates on important issues such as immigration, our current economy, the role of guns in our society, the rising of white nationalism with its inherent racism in our country, even climate change!, reduced to fear, sometimes even by people whose intellect I respected. Making people afraid is the quicker way to get a group to follow you.

Why is that? Because we want to be in a group for security? Because we are intrinsically angry people who find it more socially acceptable to yell if we're in a group?

Maybe it's because one of our biggest fears is that we might become the one who is outcast. Maybe it's because we recognize a little bit of ourselves in what we've been taught to fear and hate. And we want to run away. I don't know.

All I know is that the command of God...the command of Christ...over and over and over again is not to be afraid. To respect God (which is what the fear of the Lord is about), but not to be afraid. And replace fear with love. Real love, which seeks to gather together instead of break apart. Real love, which seeks to find neighbors everywhere.

A story is told of a rabbi who asked his students, "When can we know that the night has ended and the day begun?"

"Is it the moment," asked one student, "when you can tell the difference between a sheep and a dog?"

"No," said the rabbi.

"Is it," said another, "when you can see the difference between a fig tree and an olive tree?"

"Not that either," replied the rabbi.

"Then when is it?" the students asked.

The rabbi answered, "It is the moment when you can look at a face never seen before and recognize the stranger as a brother or sister. Until that moment, no matter how bright the day, it is still night."

We are the people through whom the light of Christ can shine. But as long as we carry around the fear of the other, we diminish and hide the dawn and live in the night. I wish peace to each of you...the peace that casts out fear. See you in worship!


2019 Calendar for Altar Flowers Posted


