We are still receiving donations for the survivors of the Bastrop fire, the Steiner Ranch fire and the Spicewood fire.

- cash donations with "Advance #2050 Wildfire Relief in the memo line (made out to Memorial UMC)
- items for the "burn buckets":
 - Pine-based cleaner
 - Liquid household bleach (1 82 oz. or 2 1 quart bottles)
 - Household cleaner (12-16 oz bottle)
 - Liquid laundry detergent (2 25 oz or 1 50 oz bottle)
 - Pair of work gloves
 - 2 pairs of latex gloves
 - scrub brush
 - 18 re-usable cleaning cloths/wipes
 - dry cleaning sponges
 - 6 regular sponges
 - 5 dust masks (preferably N-95)
 - 24-bag roll of large heavy duty trash bags
 - 1 bottle vanilla extract

A Note From the Pastor

The fires that have devastated the areas surrounding Austin, especially east of Austin have brought back all kinds of memories.

Memories I had of finding out at age 8 that a friend in the town that we had moved from just a few months earlier had been killed in a house fire.

Memories of having to keep undergrads at Duke from setting inappropriate things on fire in the dorm...and keeping them safe during the bonfires that inevitably came on that campus with a winning men's basketball team.

Memories of fires that almost went wrong in churches I've served - the advent wreath that caught on fire one Christmas Eve (we put it out rather quickly) and the Memorial Day candles that somehow tipped over in the sand basin we had them in and created their own mini cauldron of flame (which also got put out rather quickly).

But the most devastating was the call I got on the first Sunday of Advent in 2002. We had a rather warm morning at Runge UMC - something was wrong with the thermostat, and the heater seemed to be trying to keep it at 85. When someone went into the attic to investigate that afternoon, the rush of oxygen sparked and the church was quickly engulfed in flames. Everyone was fine, but it was a total loss.

All that history. The space that had meant so much to so many people.

But during that week when I was going back and forth to meet with claims adjusters and try to see what we could pick out of the wreckage, we found that someone had left a poinsettia in the midst of the rubble.

And I heard again the words of the hymn, "I lay in dust, life's glory dead/And from the ground there blossoms red, life that shall endless be."

Where have you experienced burn out? Where does life feel like a total loss? Can you imagine that even now, even in Bastrop, even in Steiner Ranch, even in you...God is planting and preparing to do something new, something eternal? We get to participate in that - in bringing hope and tending what God is growing. Thank you for being there. Be there for the people of Bastrop. Be there for each other. Let God grow something in the midst of the ashes.

OUR YOUTH ARE ON THE GO!

They had a wonderful but busy summer with our Youth Intern, Lacy. They started the summer with a trip to Fiesta Texas and then continued on, joining the youth group from St. Mark UMC and alternating locations for their meeting.

Lacy reported to the Administrative Council in September: "A typical youth meeting consists of eating lunch together, playing games, and having a Bible study. Depending on the topic, we sometimes split up in groups of boys and girls for the Bible study lesson. Since the beginning of the summer, I have seen a definite change in many of the kids' participation during this time. They are learning to look up scripture as well as becoming more comfortable giving input and asking questions during the lessons.

"Aside from our normal weekly youth meetings, we have had several fun events throughout the summer. Almost all of our youth participated in VBS by helping set up, tear down, and volunteering each night. At the end of the VBS week, we spent the afternoon at Barton Springs to celebrate the success of their involvement in such an important ministry. A few weeks ago, we went to the Main Event after lunch and spent the afternoon playing games and rock climbing together. It was really encouraging to see how much the kids have seemed to grow as a group in just a few months. Finally, on Friday, September 2 we had our much anticipated back to school lock in. We had a total of twenty two youth attend the event. In addition to youth and adults from Memorial being present, we also had a few from St. Mark and a large group from Covenant UMC. The night was a huge success. The kids were split up into teams with which they competed in several games throughout the night, including a mega relay of messy games. In addition to having lots of fun, the kids participated in a really great worship service led by a team of college students. They broke up into small groups after the message and I saw some of them really open up to each other. I think it was a great beginning to the new school year."

Thanks to Lacy, Kendall and everyone else who has worked with our youth this summer. Encourage the junior high and high schoolers you know to "stay for the after party" on Sunday afternoons as our youth seek to know Christ better!


